Getting started

When starting to think about a new school it can be helpful to:

- talk to your child. What are they looking forward to?
 Do they have any concerns?
- think about what is important to you. Make a list of things that you want to know about a new school.
- seek advice from teachers at your child's current school or nursery.

Finding out about a school

It is really important to visit schools before making your application. If you cannot get to a school open day or evening, you can contact the school and make an appointment to visit at another time.

Every school should be able to provide you with a school prospectus. This should have lots of information about the school in it.

Visit the school's website but be aware that the amount and quality of information can vary a great deal from one website to another.

It can be useful to talk to parents whose children go to the school you are finding out about. However, you should always check details with the school for yourself as things can change from year to year.
