Dear Parent/Carer of

This is the second of three letters we will be sending to all parents of children who will be joining us in September. We hope that you will find them a useful way of staying in touch, as well as being a guide to the many opportunities we offer our students. We are very confident about the educational standards and range of academic and enrichment opportunities we will be able to offer, and would like to share some with you.

One of the strengths of Sir John Lemman High School is that we offer a broad and relevant curriculum to all of our students. A key feature of our Year 7 Curriculum, over and above the standard subjects of the National Curriculum, is the 'Skills Day'. Students take part in a range of cross-curricular projects for one day a week, which focus on developing their Personal, Learning and Thinking Skills. We know from experience that these are essential skills which are transferable across the curriculum, serving students well as they move through the school. As well as subject lessons, we are proud of our range of enrichment offers which include Latin, Work Related Learning events and themed days. In fact we have run over 85 educational visits so far this year! It has been a busy few weeks for us all. Whilst your has been preparing for their Key Stage 2 SATs, we have had many sporting successes, school concerts alongside a host of extra-curricular activities such as music groups, choir, film club, board games, sport, languages club, drama, art, science and design and technology clubs. We hope that will take up some of these new opportunities when they begin their time with us.

We have now had two successful Saturday morning workshops for our new students, and enclose an invitation to our third on Saturday, 30 June. You are welcome to bring your child and then join us for refreshments from 9.30am so that you can have an informal chat with members of the Leadership Team, followed at 9.45am with an online safety presentation of 30 minutes by Ms Gurney, Deputy Headteacher. Parents and carers are then asked to return at 12 noon to collect students.

Mrs Francis, Assistant Headteacher and Director of Lower School, Mr Cable, Year 7 Manager and Mrs L Guttridge, Lower School Academic Mentor, will be meeting staff in the many primary schools from which students join us. They will also be visiting students in their current schools to talk to them about some of the exciting opportunities they will have at our school, and to answer their questions. I always look forward to meeting our new students, and I know they appreciate the fact that we commit time to helping them to settle in confidently. To ensure that everything runs smoothly, our dedicated team of 'Here 2 Help' students will be working hard to ensure the first few days at High School go smoothly. These Year 7 students are currently busy thinking of ideas to help with the transfer to Sir John Lemman High School; they have been through it, and know what new students might be thinking! Understandably, we have had some enquiries from new parents about transport. In fact we have very little input into County travel arrangements, although we supervise the arrival and departure of buses from our site. If your child is in catchment and eligible for free transport from County, you will receive details and a pass during the summer holidays. If for any reason (such as non-receipt of a pass, a lost pass, or a change of address) you need to contact School Transport, the number is 0345 6066173. For students who are 'out of catchment', you can register your child for one of the school buses that operates from Kessingland, Carlton Colville, Oulton, Lowestoft, Blundeston and Southwold, please visit [www.Border-Bus.co.uk](http://www.Border-Bus.co.uk), then select SJL bus registration Sept 2018. Once you are registered, BorderBus will send out details for the 2018-19 term.

I also enclose information about our school uniform; a checklist and an order form. 'Screens', our uniform supplier, will be present at the information evening for you to look at uniform, try on samples, and place and pay for orders.

All our new students are asked to complete a short form to tell us more about their likes, dislikes, and interests, so that their teachers can start to get to know them. We will also ask them to give us some ideas about any preferences regarding tutor groups; and will take the advice of their current teachers as well. This is enclosed, and we would appreciate its return before half term so that we can allocate students to tutor groups. Could we please ask that they complete it themselves and that they include surnames as well as first names?

My third letter, which will be sent out at the start of July, will contain details about your child's tutor group, as well as arrangements for the transition days of activities to be held here for new students.

A relatively new idea we are continuing with this year is providing all Year 6 students with a 'gift folder' which includes activities, challenges and information. All of these activities are designed to help students and us during the transition period between primary and secondary school; so teachers can get to know students as quickly as possible and plan lessons to support and challenge them. In some primary schools

these activities will be done in lesson time but for other students these tasks will need to be completed at home and brought with them on the Transition Days in July.

**Wednesday 18, Thursday 19, Friday 20 July:** Activities at Sir John Leman High for all new students from 8.45am - 3.15pm. Information about this will follow in my next letter.

# School Uniform

All students must wear the following uniform:

- A navy blue blazer with school badge from the school uniform provider
- A white shirt either with long or short sleeves
- A school tie (clip on)
- Tailored black trousers or skirt (knee length or longer, not jersey or lycra material) or tailored knee length shorts
- Polishable formal black shoes only: no boots, sandals, or trainers to be worn as uniform

Optional:

- A navy blue v-neck jumper with badge from the school uniform provider (please note that cardigans may not be worn).

Outdoor coats must have a fastening (not hoodies) and cannot be worn over or under blazers in school.

## Jewellery

No wearing of large or excessive amounts of jewellery, i.e. more than one finger ring, 1 small stud in each ear (not stretchers) and 1 bracelet. No facial piercings are allowed of any kind, including the nose.

**Make up** – In Years 7, 8 and 9, no make-up is permitted of any kind including nail varnish.

We have tried to make the school uniform as simple and cost effective as possible. Failure to comply with this uniform will result in your child being asked to work away from their normal lessons. Students will be required to remove make up before attending lessons.

The computers are provided and maintained for the benefit of all students, and you are encouraged to use and enjoy these resources, and help to ensure they remain available to all. You are responsible for good behaviour with the resources and on the Internet just as you are in a classroom or a school corridor. Remember that access is a privilege, not a right and inappropriate use could result in that privilege being withdrawn.

**NO STUDENT SHOULD BE IN A COMPUTER ROOM WITHOUT THE SUPERVISION OF A MEMBER OF STAFF.**

### Equipment

- Do not install, attempt to install or store programs of any type on the computers.
- Damaging, disabling, or otherwise harming the operation of computers, or intentionally wasting resources puts your work and the work of others at risk, and is prohibited.

### Internet

- **Only access suitable material – Using the Internet to obtain, download, send, print, display or otherwise transmit or gain access to materials which are unlawful, obscene or abusive is not permitted.**
- Respect the work and ownership rights of people outside the school, as well as other students or staff. This includes abiding by copyright laws.

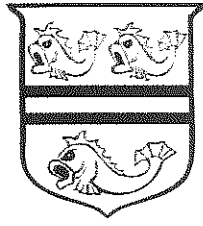

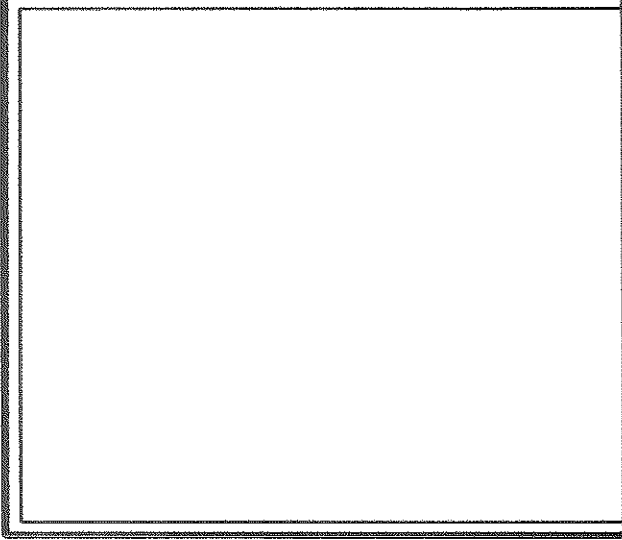
