

## Behaviour Policy 2020 Covid-19 Addendum

Whilst expectations in our Behaviour Policy remain pertinent, it is necessary, in light of the Covid-19 pandemic, to make some adjustments for the safety of all pupils and staff.

These adjustments are set out below:

### Rewards

Dojo points will continue to be used. Teachers and Teaching Assistants welcome opportunities to reward individuals for good work, attitude or good behaviour. Above all, praise and encouragement will be used as much as possible.

Unfortunately our Celebration Assembly for parents will be postponed for the foreseeable future.

### Consequences

Before consequences are given, children need to have been given the opportunity to learn and understand the rules e.g. how and why we social distance and wash hands. Modelling and teaching will need to be implemented before consequences are used.

Our 'road system' will remain in place but children will not be able to work in another classroom and social distancing rules will apply. The SaFS team and SLT will support where necessary.

We have amended the consequence flow chart for Bubble School. This can be found below.

Some of the behaviours have different consequences depending on contexts, severity and the age of the child.

### Amended Consequences

Verbal warning  
(a reminder about behaviour)

In-class time-out  
(Five minute time-out in class)



- Calling out
- Lack of attention
- Not treating equipment with respect
- Failure to follow an instruction
- Making inappropriate noises
- Purposely not following the social distancing rules.

Lunch time reflection



- Inappropriate language
- Minor physical assault (e.g. pushing)
- Consistent disruption of teaching and learning
- Disrespect of adults / peers
- Persistently not following instructions
- Persistently not following social distancing rules

Internal exclusion

External exclusion (Fixed)

Permanent exclusion



- Spitting
- Intimidation
- Throwing furniture
- Physical Assault
- Damage to school property
- Fighting
- Racist or other hate comments
- Persistently refusing to keep to social distancing rules

External Exclusion (Fixed)

Permanent Exclusion



- COVID-based attacks – spitting, biting with intent to spread the virus / or fear of the virus.
